Why Paw Pals

What do we Offer:

For young people (Year 3 to Year 8) we have two main services:

- **School-Based Small Groups:** (Up to 8 students) sessions held in your school. We come to you.
- 1:1 Student Support: Individualised support in diverse learning environments. We can visit you at schools, residential care homes, foster care placements and our MacKillop spaces.

What do the Paw Pals do:

Our facilitators and Paw Pals run individualised sessions to develop confidence, knowledge, skills, and positive learning experiences. Each session is tailored with activities to support the needs of the participants.

Example Session Plans:

Safety Plans

We create visual cards of emotional management skills, practices and techniques with our Paw Pal to build emotional management practice and develop selfregulation.



Emotional Literacy

In this activity, students roll a dice with their Paw Pal to choose a feeling to explore together. Animals express a range of emotions through body language and behaviour. Learning to recognise these cues fosters empathy and emotional attunement



Literacy and Numeracy Activities

Storytelling sessions allow students to create and share stories inspired by the therapy dogs. This activity enhances creative writing and encourages students to express themselves in a positive and imaginative way.



Friendship Skills

Our friendship skills curriculum is designed to teach patience, trust, teamwork and cooperation.
